Program Description

Over the past couple of years, several Catholic ministry associations (Partners in the Pastoral Care Ministry) convened with the support of the Raskob Foundation, to examine the diverse settings within which pastoral care is needed, to identify core competencies needed for those providing pastoral care, to highlight good practices in preparing to offer pastoral care, and to provide networking and resources for those involved in the formation for pastoral care ministry. As part of our efforts, in the coming years our Partners in the Pastoral Care Ministry want to provide those responsible for pastoral care preparation in dioceses, education institutions, formation programs, and other organizations opportunities to learn from those responsible for existing or new efforts to prepare men and women for this pastoral care ministry.

This first streamed session will feature colleagues from the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston, who will present an overview of a major diocesan initiative: assessing pastoral care needs, designing and implementing a multiple-dimensional program addressing those needs, and developing a three-tier educational program to equip Catholic laity to provide pastoral care ministry. This multiple-year project will provide a significant expansion of ministry to hospitals in the Texas Medical Center and other healthcare institutions throughout the Archdiocese, as well impact the pastoral care provided in so many diverse settings in the Archdiocese. Presenters will offer assessment of the program's progress after the first six months of operation and projections for the next 6-12 months. Presenters will share the extensive preparation and implementation strategy, as well as the core content of the in-person and online program.

Objectives

Participants will:

1. Gain an overview of the Partners in the Pastoral Care Ministry initiative and the potential value of the newly developed Competencies for Pastoral care, and how they can participate in this initiative.
2. Learn about the implementation phase of the Galveston-Houston's pastoral care initiative, followed by plans to advance the program in the coming months.
3. Understand this model's approach to equip Catholic laypersons to assume the role of Pastoral Visitor by providing pastoral care to patients and families. Gain knowledge of the diocesan Catholic Chaplain Corps formation program, and the early insights of the program's performance, and what can be helpful to other dioceses that have or plan to implement a diocesan pastoral care training program.
4. Become part of a network of professionals involved in the preparation of others for the pastoral care ministry.
